

Neptunus regem Troianorum non amabat et, quod eum punire cupiebat, monstrum saevissimum e mari misit. ubi rex monstrum vidit, perterritus erat. “quid faciam?” inquit. “nonne monstrum urbem meam delebit?” itaque filiam suam monstro sacrificare constituit et eam ad mare duxit. puella haec verba tristissima dicebat: “noli me hic relinquere, pater. monstrum iam appropinquit. serva me.” pater autem verba filiae non audiebat. subito autem Hercules advenit. puellam prope undas maris conspexit. “noli timere, puella,” inquit. “nam te defendam et monstrum statim necabo.” una sagitta sola Hercules monstrum occidit. rex laetissimus erat. “tu filiam meam servavisti,” inquit. “ego tibi equos meos pulcherrimos dabo.” deinde autem furor regem superavit. “illos equos non dabo,” inquit. “e terra mea sine mora abi.” Hercules iratus erat. urbem oppugnavit et regem necavit.

Ajax, a Greek warrior, defends the Greek ships from a Trojan attack.

Achilles erat optimus omnium Graecorum, sed Ajax quoque miles audacissimus erat. olim Achilles pugnare nolebat, et in tabernaculo suo manere constituerat. itaque plurimi Troiani ad castra Graecorum ruebloant. Graeci fortiter pugnabant, sed superabantur. Ajax Troianos tandem navibus Graecis appropinquantes vidit, et hastam ingentem, quae prope posita erat, corripuit. deinde in nave stetit ut amicos defendereret. Troiani ducem Graecum telis oppugnabant, sed ille magna voce clamavit, “muros non habemus, Troiani, sed arma et milites. virtus nostra numquam vincetur. redite igitur in urbem vestram, in qua rex vester perterritus se celat!” Troiani, ubi haec audiverunt, quamquam iratissimi erant, non Aiacem interficere poterant. nam Graecis persuaserat ut naves defenderent, et tandem Troiani e castris pulsi sunt. Achilles autem periculo amicorum non movebatur. nonne vir crudelissimus erat?
